This week, we welcomed lots of visitors into school. Y6 enjoyed the experience of learning from an archaeologist who has studied the Ancient Maya. Each week, we have two prize draws in assembly. If your child's name is pulled out and they have read three times or more, they receive a £5 voucher for Meadowhall. Every person who has read three times receives house points and extra points for 6 reads.

Each class also has a chart. When the chart is full, all children who have their name on the chart 5 times or more receive the reward that that class have decided upon.

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Our wonderful Y6 pupils have opened their own bookshop! It opens on a Tuesday in the KS1 playground (weather dependent) and in the hall on a Tuesday for KS2 at playtime. Books are priced at 50p for pre-loved books and new books are £1.50, £2.50 or £3.50. #### Uniform/ Hair styles

Reminder – it is school policy (and the home school agreement) that all children follow the uniform policy.

Children are expected to wear black shoes or trainers (unless it is PE day in KS2). Children must not come to school with dyed/ colourful hair or additional bright colours in their hair or have shaved shapes/ designs in their hair. We appreciate that children might have special styles for birthdays, special events etc but ask that you keep these to the weekends and holidays and remove them for school.

## Lates

We are seeing an increase in the number of children who are arriving late to school. Please be aware that the first official lesson of the day starts at 8:55 each morning. If children miss the start of the maths lesson, they find it very difficult to keep up with the rest of the class so it is essential that children come to school on time each day.

#### Public Health

Since the pandemic, school regularly attend council Public Health meetings where information about COVID and other viruses are shared.

Points to note from Public Health:

- Children should not attend school if they have a high temperature and are unwell.
- Children who have sore throats, sniffles etc but are otherwise well are still fine to come to school UNLESS they also have a high temperature.
- It is not recommended that children and young people are tested for COVID-19 unless directed by a health professional. If you do test your child and they are positive, they should remain at home for three days after the date of the test or longer if they are still unwell.
- Within Rotherham there has been a number of cases of Scarlet Fever. <u>Please be</u> <u>alert to rashes and red spots on your child's body.</u> Please seek the advice of a doctor or pharmacist asap if your child develops a rash. If otherwise well, once they have 24hours+ worth of a course of antibiotics, they can return to school as they are no longer contagious.
- There is also an increase in the number of cases of chicken pox in the borough.
