



Year Four Autumn Term 1

English

In our English lessons this half term, we will be looking at a fictional text and a non-fictional text.

We will be using the Talk for Writing framework with a focus on warning stories and information texts. Children will imitate and innovate these texts before their own independent pieces.

We will be

- Using inverted commas accurately
- Using expanded noun phrases to give additional detail
- Using a wide range of conjunctions
- Composing and rehearsing sentences orally
- Progressively building a rich and varied vocabulary
- Using fronted adverbials and adverbial phrases

For the fiction text, 'The Canal', we will be using the characterisation toolkit. In this we will explore how to show a character's emotions through their actions, thoughts, hobbies and joys.

For the non-fiction text, 'The Tree Giant', we will look at organising paragraphs around a theme, using heading and sub-headings and using technical language.

Science

Our Science unit this half term is all about animals, including humans. We will be identifying the different types of teeth in humans and their simple functions. We will look at the simple functions of the digestive system in humans. We will also construct and interpret a variety of food chains, identifying producers, predators and prey.

We will work scientifically by asking relevant questions, finding evidence and conducting experiments to solve enquiry questions.

Art

In art, the children will be taking part in a few bespoke sessions revising pencil skills, including shading and sketching. They will apply these to tree and nature sketches and we will visit a local field/forest area for inspiration.

Spanish

In our Spanish unit for the next term, we will be learning the language of animals, classroom instructions and parts of the body. We will do this through repetition, songs and poetry.

Religious Education

Our R.E unit for the next term is all about Christians and Hindus. We will explore Christian and Hindu beliefs about God and about life's journey through stories, examples and practises. The focus is on developing learners understanding of what makes a good question

Mathematics

Our mathematics this half term are place value and addition and subtraction.

In our place value unit, we will be consolidating and building on our previous knowledge of the value of numbers. We will be rounding to the nearest 10 and 100, learning how to represent four-digit numbers and exploring numbers all the way up to 10,000.

In our addition and subtraction unit, we will be adding and subtracting two four-digit numbers, estimating answers and using this knowledge to solve a variety of word and number problems.

Key Vocabulary:

Tens, hundreds, thousands, rounding, order, more than, less than, partition, numerals, nearest, distance, thousands, ascending, descending, negative, step, multiple, greater than, less than.

Addition, total, more than, subtraction, less than, column method, estimate, how much, strategy, efficient, accurate, exact, fact, diagram.

Geography

Our Geography unit this half term is all about trade and transportation. In this unit, we will explore different types of transportation and the advantages and disadvantages of using them. We will explore international trade, what this means and which countries export which foods. We will also look at why certain countries are appropriate for growing certain foods and how this contributes to trading around the world.

Physical Education

We will be participating in two Physical Education units this half term. We will be using the iMoves scheme to complete lessons in dance and gymnastics.

Music

In music, Mr Kinmans will be teaching the children how to play the ukulele. The children will learn the parts of the instrument, some of the keys and play a few short songs.

Personal, Social and Emotional development.

Our PSHE unit this half term is all about the caring school and feelings, friends and friendships.
