## Message from Mrs Bradbury....

We are really pleased with the learning that the children have done so far this half term. All classes are working hard and there have been so many achievements. In assembly, we have introduced 'Maths Masters' and 'Presentation Perfectionists' and one person from each class (or maths group) is nominated each week. The children have responded so well to this and are really keen to improve their skills and gain a nomination. All those nominated have received a huge 20 house points and get to place their nomination into the prize draw. At the end of the half term, four hard-working students will be drawn out to receive a bonus £20 voucher. You can help by encouraging your child to practise and improve their presentation and be an active part of maths lessons.

Thank you to everyone who donated items for the harvest festival in school. As ever, we are blown away by the generosity of our community. All donations will go to Charlie's Pantry to help our community.

## **Parent and Carer Survey**

Before the summer, we conducted our annual parent and carer survey. We are pleased to report that the survey was extremely positive in every area. 98% of parents and carers identified that the school provides a good range of subjects. 97% of parents responded that the wider personal development is supported at school – this is something that Ofsted recognised as outstanding and beyond what other schools offer. 98% of parents and carers responded positively that their child does well at Redscope. 98% of parents and carers responded that Redscope promotes a love of reading which is something that is very important to all of us in the Redscope team. We asked a range of additional questions to help us plan the year ahead and trial new approaches.

**You said** ... You would be prepared to pay more for school trips and experiences and would sooner the children have the experience.

We did ... We have expanded the amount of school trips and visits, therefore increasing the contributions slightly. We will monitor this closely this year as school cannot afford to subsidise visits beyond what we do already. If we do not get sufficient contributions then we will have to cancel visits. Where we do have a subsidy this is for ALL children so all families get the saving for instance our Murton Park visit should cost £31.50, but school are contributing to make the experience cheaper for all families.

You said ... You would like the newsletter once per month.

We did ... We have introduced a monthly newsletter rather than fortnightly.

You said... You would like more communication about what your child is learning and doing at school. We did ... We have introduced dojo to all classes. This means that you get an insight into school life in terms of photographs of the class learning and a weekly update about the learning and that for the week ahead. This is a good time to remind you that teachers are expected to be teaching rather than blogging so will just be updating/ uploading photos once per week (unless there is a trip or special occasion). Dojo is not the place to air any complaints or for negative comments etc.

You said .... You would like to know what homework is expected each week and would like children to practise their maths more regularly (in paper form).

We did ... Alongside our expectation of weekly reading (minimum 3 times) and weekly spellings, we have introduced a paper-based weekly arithmetic task. We have made this the same format each week so that the children are used to it and so that you know that it is to complement the weekly arithmetic sessions in school. Any learning set on this, will have been taught in class. By having the same format, there should be less opportunity for the children to be stuck on anything as it should be familiar to them. As new learning is introduced or recapped it will be added to the arithmetic questions. Weekly spellings and arithmetic are also put onto Dojo. The maths home learning is alongside using TTrockstars and Numbots which are online.

**You said...** You would be happy to support a wide variety of fun events for the children and fundraise for school. **We did** ... We have already introduced our 'Redscope Pumpkin Patch' for 21<sup>st</sup> October after school. This is a ticket only event so please see the office or pay on Arbor if your child would like a ticket. The strongest response was for after school discos so we have implemented this straight away with our spooky disco and other events pencilled in for later in the year.

We hope that is has been helpful to have as many events as possible e.g. Christmas Concerts, Sports day etc confirmed at this point of the year so that you can plan time off work if attending.

## Attendance and Lateness

The Trust attendance target is 97% and whilst we understand that children have illnesses they should be in school as much as possible so that they are achieving the best outcomes.

School attendance so far this year is 94.94%

**104 hours** of learning has been missed so far this year due to lateness

## Please help us to help you by:

- Try to telephone the school before 8.30am each day of your child's absence.
- Tell the school in advance, of any medical appointments and bring in appointment cards/letters.
- If you are not sure whether your child is well enough to attend school, send them in anyway as they often perk up on arrival.
- Have a backup plan for if your child misses transport, call on a family member, neighbour or friend.
- If you and your child are experiencing difficulties with school attendance then talk to us as a first step so we can help!
