<ul> <li>English This half term we will be using Talk for Writing to learn a journey tale. An adaptation of 'The Hobbit' will be used for this. We will use the dialogue and action toolkits to innovate and create an independent piece of writing. In this topic we will be distinguishing between rhythm and tempo. We will also create a simple rhythm, experimenting with beats per minute.</li> <li>We will also create a melodic phrase experimenting with pitch and compose a piece of electronic music considering pitch, rhythm and melody.</li> </ul>	MathematicsWe will be recognising and using fractions as numbers: unit fractions and non-unit fractions with small denominators, using diagrams, equivalent fractions with small denominators and comparing and ordering unit fractions, and fractions with the same denominators. We will also be using diagrams, families of common equivalent fractions and solving problems involving increasingly harder fractions to calculate quantities, and fractions to divide quantities. Our next unit will be on decimals. In this unit we will learn how recognise and write decimal equivalents of any number of tenths or hundredths and we will find the effect of dividing a one- or two-digit number by 10 and 100, identifying the value of the digits in the answer as ones, tenths and hundredths. We will be visiting Murton Park as part of our topic where the children will get to explore what life was like for Viking settlers. We will also be introducing the children to what a virus is, how we can minimise the risk to ourselves and about immunisations.
