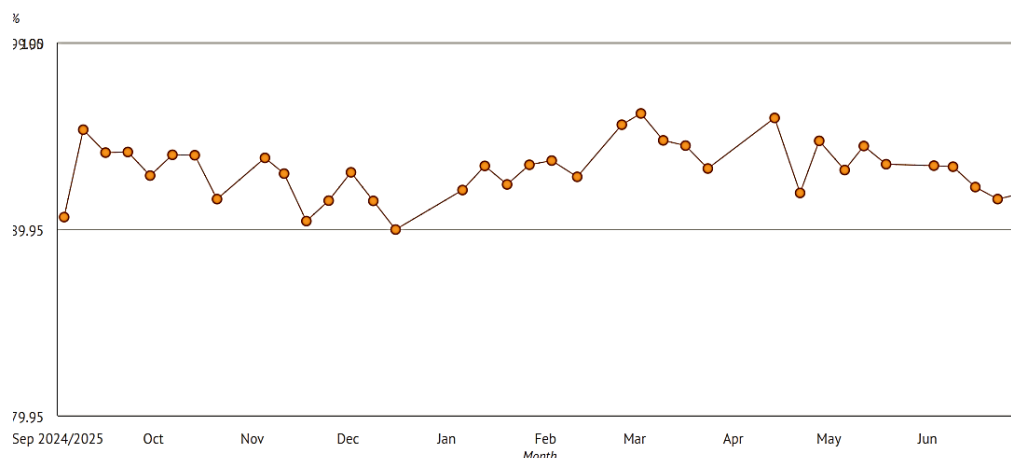


Attendance and Lateness

The schools attendance is currently 93.2% for the year. This last term attendance has been down by nearly 5% only just hitting 90% some days and the number of holidays in term time has increased hugely.

Please remember that under the new Government legislation the Local Authority will consider issuing a Fixed Penalty Notice for children who are of statutory school age and have 10 or more unauthorised absences (5days) in a 10 week space (these do not have to be consecutive days).

We appreciate the effort made by parents to ensure children are in school everyday.



The sun is shining.....

As the warm weather is now here, we would like to remind you of a few bits and bobs.

- Children should come to school wearing suncream. (If you wish for them to put their own suncream on at lunchtime, please send a small bottle in their bag. This will need to be done by the child and should be labelled with their name. Due to sun sensitivities and allergies, children cannot share suncream.)
- Children should also bring a water bottle (Not REY as water is provided) with their name on it.
- Children are advised to bring a sun hat.

Summer Uniform

- Plain black or grey formal school trousers, tailored black or grey school shorts or a plain black or grey knee length skirt.
- Red and white checked school dresses and red and white checked all-in-one shorts-suits are also allowed.

Children should not come to school in branded items and all formal trousers etc should be plain.

- All children are expected to wear a red sweatshirt or cardigan over a white/red polo shirt.
- Shoes
- Children should come to school wearing plain black flat shoes or plain black trainers.

PE Kit

- Plain white t-shirt
- Plain black shorts (e.g. school PE shorts or black cycling shorts), plain black tracksuit bottoms or plain black leggings
- PE Pumps/ trainers for outdoor PE
- Black Trainers
- (Pupils in Classes 7,8,9,10,11,12,13,14 may wear PE kit to school only on their PE days. This may be tracksuit bottoms or leggings with a school jumper or sweatshirt over the top.)
