English

For our English work this half term, we will be using our North America topic as a stimulus for writing a narrative based around Dia de los Muertos and persuasive writing linked to holidays and hotels.

Alongside our writing units, we will be teaching elements of Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling, through Place Value of Punctuation, to help to write with increased accuracy and awareness of sentence structure.

Each week, your child will receive a set of spellings to learn at home with a specific pattern or focus. Please encourage them to practise them so they become familiar words. Every child has a Spelling Frame login; it is expectation that every child will use this online resource to practise the spelling rule.

We will continue to use Cambridge PenPals to strengthen handwriting across school. Within Year 6, we will have focused handwriting sessions twice a week to practise letter joins as all children are expected to write at speed in a joined style by the end of Year 6.

Mathematics

Unit 4- Fractions 1

In this unit, children extend their understanding of fractions and mixed numbers by adding and subtracting unrelated fractions by finding common denominators. Children continue to develop their reasoning and problem-solving skills while exploring efficient methods.

Unit 5- Fractions 2

This unit builds on children's fraction work in previous units, including multiplying a proper fraction by a whole number and finding a fraction of an amount. It aims to bring together the four operations with fractions and give children confidence in problem solving with fractions.

Unit 9- Decimals

This unit builds on children's understanding of decimals and fractions as part of a whole and applies learning about multiplication and division methods to working with decimals.

Religious Education

Our first unit is entitled Beliefs and actions in the world: Can Christian Aid and Islamic Relief change the world? Children will learn about the work of two major faith-based charities, Christian Aid and Islamic Relief. They will develop their understanding of the impact of religion in the world and ask important questions of justice. They will have the opportunity to develop opinions of their own and consider key beliefs.

Physical Education

For all PE sessions, long hair needs to be tied back and earrings removed. If your child cannot remove their own earrings, please do this before school.

Icommunicate

This unit, icommunicate focuses on the importance of social interactions and verbal and non-verbal communication. By completing activities that encourage and reward teamwork, feedback and

	leadership; pupils will become better placed to incorporate these vital communication skills into their everyday lives.
<u>Geography</u> Our geography unit of work this half term is North America. Within this unit, we will be finding out which countries make up North America, where North America is located in the world, what the climate of North America is like and what physical features make up North America. <u>Key Vocabulary</u> Latitude, lowlands, agricultural, predominant, colonised, indigenous, populous, sparsely, metropolitan, topographic, subduction	<u>Art</u> This half term, we will be exploring the work of Jim Dine. We will be creating calendars in the style of Pop Art. Jim Dine creates abstract art using bold, bright colours. We will be layering the colours and developing our understanding of pattern and shape. <u>Key Vocabulary</u> Motif, colour, form, texture, collage, symbolism.
<u>PSHE</u> Our PSHE unit this half term is Growing Up-Responsibilities. Within this unit, we will discuss challenges that we may face in our lives and how we can overcome these using coping strategies. We will be discussing responsibilities that the children have and who is responsible to keep them safe and healthy. We will also be looking at mental and physical health and how children can stay healthy through physical exercise and a healthy diet. <u>Key Vocabulary</u> Healthy, Impact, Mental Health, Nutrition, Physical Health, Positive attitude, Prejudice, Realistic, Responsibility, Rights, Self Esteem, Support, Teamwork, Treatment Violated, Wellbeing	<u>Computing</u> In computing this half term, we will be continuing using 2Simple to practise our coding skills. During these sessions, we will be designing, coding, testing and debugging for different aspects of computer programming. We will be understanding how an IF statement works, understanding how to use co-ordinates in computer programming, understanding the 'repeat until' command, understanding how an IF/ELSE statement works and understanding what a variable is in programming.
<u>Science</u> In Science this half term, our unit will be light. Children will learn that light travels in straight lines and investigate that shadows have the same shape as the object that cast them. Children will be using an investigative approach to a series of light challenges and posing scientific questions to further their knowledge of light. <u>Key Vocabulary</u> Light source, translucent, transparent, opaque, prism, reflect, refract, spectrum, absorption, dispersion	<u>Visits and Visitors</u> STEM workshop- Thursday 20 th October
<u>How can you help at home?</u> *Please encourage your child to participate in our Redscope Reading Challenge. We have a range of fantastic age-appropriate books which are perfect for children to read independently or to share as a family and an amazing selection of books in our library. All children should be reading for 15 minutes at least three times per week and these sessions should be logged in their planner. *All children learn a new spelling pattern/rule each week. Please discuss the rule with your child and help them to learn the spellings that they have been given. All children have a login and password for Spelling Frame and should be accessing this weekly to practise the rule taught. *In maths, please encourage your child to access Times Table Rockstars to help them to recall their table facts quickly. Your child's login details are in their planners if they are unsure of how to access it. *We are starting the Y6 revision timetable this half term. It is important that all children complete tasks set by the deadlines.
