## Message from Mrs Bradbury....

*What a great start it has been to the term! **Our school has won the 'School of the Year'** NCLT heart award. We are beyond proud of this and feel it is fantastic recognition for our whole school community. ## Attendance

Attendance took another hit during the month of December with an average of 87.9%. Some of this was clearly due to the number of bugs and illnesses going around school. We know it can be tricky deciding whether or not to keep your child off school when they are unwell. Attached is the government guidelines about health protection, infectious diseases and whether children should be kept off school. If your child has a cough or slight cold symptoms, they are fine to come into school.

## Lateness

Lateness in school is still not improving. While we understand that occasional delays can happen, regular lateness has a significant impact on both learning and the smooth running of the school day. When children arrive late, they miss valuable learning time and can find it harder to settle into lessons. It also disrupts the class and affects the start of the day for everyone. In addition, frequent late arrivals place extra pressure on our office staff, who are constantly having to leave their work to answer the door and sign children in. This takes them away from important tasks that help keep the school running efficiently. Please help us by ensuring your child arrives on time every day. A calm and punctual start sets children up for a successful day of learning. Thank you for your support in this matter.

## Key Reminders

### Birthdays

When it is your child's birthday, if you wish, they may come to school wearing birthday badges, sashes, headbands. Your child may not want to and that is fine too.

We ask that you don't bring in items to share e.g. sweets, buns etc. Partly, this is due to allergies and special diets as we have a large number of children who require specialist items. Mainly, it creates pressure for other parents to do the same for their child's birthday and an extra expense. Times are tough and the money could be used on a gift for your own child.

### Drop Offs

All children in REY, Clever Kittens, Reception Class and Key Stage 1 (Classes 4,5,6) **MUST** be dropped off and picked up by an adult. Please do not leave your child unsupervised in the playground.

### NUTS

We have a number of children with airborne nut allergies. Please don't send your child with nuts or nut spreads to school.

Please save these for a snack in your own home.

## DOJO

Please ensure that you have given consent for Class Dojo. The teachers have lots of pictures but can only post them once children have permission.

### Lunch Supervision and Dinners

All school meals should be paid for in advance on Arbor. Huge thanks to the vast majority of parents who do this.

### Breakfast Club

Every day, we offer breakfast club for our children from 7.45am.

### Rainbows After School Childcare

Every day, we offer after school childcare. This is across in our REY building.

- Home time to 4:30 Children have a light snack e.g. toast £5.50
- Home time to 5:30 Children have a bigger snack e.g. beans on toast £10
- **On a Monday and Friday, Rainbows offers Forest School Friday until 4:30 where the children take part in outside activities too e.g. cooking on a campfire, den building, scavenger hunts.**
- Later finish is available at additional cost.

Breakfast Club and Rainbows are a Pay as you Go service. Clubs must be **booked and paid** for in advance on Arbor to secure the place.

### Parking

The zig zag lines outside of school are there to protect our children and not to be parked across.

Please can we remind you the car park is for staff use only and should be used under no circumstances unless agreed in an emergency.

### Cashless

We are now cashless school and any payments must be made through Arbor.

## Bikes and scooters in school

Before Christmas we had a few instances where bikes and scooters were ridden on the school premises causing some near misses. Any child that rides a bike or scooter to school and leaves on the school premises now needs a bike and scooter agreement signing.
